**Application Process for Post-Graduate
Clinical Training in Physics of Radiation Oncology**

- 1. Curriculum Vitae, including (but not limited to) permanent address, education, honors or distinctions, professional experience, abstracts, publications.**
- 2. Statement of Interest: a one to two page discussion of the applicant's interests and goals. This essay should include the background for interest in medical physics as well as career expectations in medical physics.**

- 3. Transcripts: Applicants must arrange to have graduate and undergraduate transcripts sent to the Program Director. It is expected that a grade point average of at least 3.5 in physics courses and 3.0 overall will have been maintained in both undergraduate and graduate courses.**
- 4. Letters of Recommendation: Three letters of recommendation attesting to the candidate's qualification must be received from individuals knowledgeable of the candidate's academic and clinical background. Two of these letters must be from college or university faculty members who have taught the student, including one from the supervisor for highest degree obtained. These letters should speak to the character and personal qualities of the applicant. This would include intelligence, responsibility, dedication, and aptitude for further training.**

Deadline for receipt of all application materials is December 31, for positions open in July of the following year.
